“Working Together, So Others May Live”

To all Irish Water Spaniel lovers,

Lately I've been asked to write a little story about my journey into the world of search and rescue and the long road of training it took myself and my exceptional dog, Lirra to get there.

First a little about the Royal Canadian Mounted Police Civilian Search Dog Association. It is the only RCMP sanctioned K9 Civilian Search and Rescue that operates in Canada, and it is based out of Alberta, Canada and comprises of approximately 30 dogs/handler teams. The teams are trained on various profiles such as wilderness search, tracking, evidence search, water search, and cadaver search. A new profile of disaster search is being introduced this summer. The teams are on a 24hr call to go anywhere in the country or wherever the requests come from around the world thru the RCMP.

As well the members and their dogs are taking the “Lost In The Woods” program into schools and boys and girls clubs, by discussing and practicing the “Rules of Survival”.

So now back to my story, our training started in late September of 2002 with an introduction by some members of the RCMP CSDA to an eager class of twenty-two people. The intro was about training and the commitment that we would have to put in on a daily basis for the next eighteen months until graduation. A Royal Canadian Mounted Police K9 officer, Cpl Jim Galloway, who had started the RCMP CSDA back in 1999, oversaw the intro and was to oversee our progress thru the next eighteen months.

The training itself started two weeks later in early October of 2002. By then already, only sixteen of us were left, the others already feeling the strain of commitment had dropped out.

Every Saturday for the next eight months training with our facilitators, "seasoned dog handlers", put us to the test. During the week, training on our own as a group. The profiles we were to be tested on in eighteen months were "people find", "large articles" (as in a t-shirt), and working ditches.

Kind of funny to start telling your dog that it's okay to rip up clothes and treat them as toys, when all these years we've been trying to keep the dogs out of the closets from eating boots and shoes.

Training for the "team" not only consists of playing in a field with your dog. Courses had to be taken as well:

- Seminars from the University of Alberta Department of Anthropology on bone remains,
- Scent Theory and Evidence handling courses from the RCMP,
- A 40 hour Search and Rescue course from Alberta Search and Rescue
- Physical Endurance Testing for the handler
- First Aid course, GPS training, etc, etc, etc....

After eight long months of training, and approximately four hundred and fifty hours of training and courses, only six of us were left.

The rest of the year had its ups and downs. The high being that they let us loose to train with the rest of the teams and amongst ourselves, continually improving our skills in reading our dogs.

The low point came two months ago when just before we were to "graduate" one of our mentors, Cpl Jim Galloway who had been overseeing our training for the last eighteen months was shot and killed during a standoff with a deranged man who was shot moments later by the tactical team. We were all with Jim hours before the fatal shooting. He was supervising our physical test of endurance that day, our last obstacle before being tested with our dogs.

Weeks later we passed our tests, all six of us, Jim would have been proud. Lirra "my partner", always-amused Jim, she impressed him with all her hard work and showed him that you don't need a German Shepard to be a Search and Rescue dog. He was always teasing me about her curly hair and her bouncing skills when she was excited. I know he liked her a lot.

Three weeks later we had our first call, a murder scene from last year. We were to look for articles and clues.

Obviously, I can't give out details; suffice to say that Lirra was awesome.....

In all this time you should know that my wife and I had our first child, Sebastien, born two months after I started training. A large commitment not only from me and Lirra but the whole family.

Now were just training weekly and waiting for the next call.

About the team:

Denis is an ex-military engineer; full fledge Fire Fighter/Emergency Medical Technician and Technical Rescue Instructor. "I just wanted to see if Lirra could do the same thing I'm into, rescuing people. She is by far one of the smartest, quick learning dogs I know".

Lirra is a five-year-old IWS from Allan Chappell, Araglin's kennel in Sherwood Park, Alberta and has the following agility titles: AADC, AGN. Besides doing agility once a week she also competes in British Columbia every first of July in the annual Frisbee competition where she always finishes first or second and puts on a good show for the crowd.

Agility by Marie-Claude Bédard

Part 1

The CKC selection process : Each handler had to send information about their accomplishments with their dog(s) (in agility, obedience, tracking etc), our passtimes and a video to see the dog(s) in action.

First of all , it is the CKC organisation who chooses the canadian team, only handlers with pure breed dogs could send their candidacy. On their website the CKC had the registration form, and it was open to anybody. The CKC started to receive the candidacies in January. After we had to wait the selection, the deadline was April first. So during those 3 months at each day I thought about that and I said to myself, « It would be a fantastic experience and a wonderful chance for an Irish Water Spaniel ».

I knew they would receive lots of candidacies, I thought my chances were thin but I had faith in my dog. Finally when I received the invitation to join the team, I was so excited and I couldn't believe what just happened to us. I wanted to tell everyone but I had to keep it for myself until the CKC would annouce the official team. After the announcement I told the great news to people around me and at each time I was so excited. I think it will be a chance to show the real potential of this marvellous breed and how versatile IWS can be.

What attracted me to agility : The complicity and bond between the handler and the dog, the speed, the challenge in different runs, that's why I choose agility. When I started I had no idea if Caroube would like this sport, but during the first weeks of training I saw she would like that very much. It's very important that the dog have fun.

I discovered agility because when we had Caroube at home, Mario (my husband) wanted to do obedience trials and I wanted to do competitions in a new discipline, I choose agility. I went to a competition and it seemed to me like it was very pleasant for the dog and for the handler. So I started this sport and I and Caroube loved it, and she was having a great time. I would never force my dog to do something he doesn't like.

In the next issue I will talk about my preparation for the agility world championship in Italy.
